The line breaks denote the pattern of clustering among the schools. Around 180 points separate IE Business School at the top, from the school ranked number 80. The top 12 business schools from IE to University of Oxford: Said, form the top group. The second group is headed by Warwick Business School, about 85 points above Porto Business School at the bottom of this group. The third group is headed by Louvain School of Management.
